The school year is well and truly coming to an end and this will be the last newsletter of the year. Let me start by saying thank you to our school community for their support of Kimbolton School in a variety of ways over the past year. It has certainly been great to welcome a few new families and to have the privilege of having such focused families and learners join us here.

Below is most of my prize giving speech. I will summarise this on the night, but prefer that prizegiving is about recognising achievements from the students and celebrating their year of learning, as opposed to listening to me talk for too long.

Four years have flown by, and it is hard to believe that it has been that long that I have had the privilege of being Principal of a school with a proactive board, supportive community, skilled educators and magnificent, interesting, motivated, sometimes funny students.

I'm hesitant to talk too much about the Wests Tigers this year, after their third consecutive wooden spoon, however I live in hope that 2025 will be better.

Similar to the Wests Tigers, we as a school continue to strive for excellence, with a core set of values and we look to set high expectations around everything we do. We just have more success along the way than the mighty tigers.

Academically, we continue to have positive success in all learning areas. Our Mathematics data has nearly a third of our students achieving above the expected standard and over 70% achieving at or above the expected standard. In Reading nearly 40% of students are achieving above the expected standard and over 80% are at or above the expected standard. In Written Language we have over 60% at or above the expected standard. I attribute supportive families, our core values, quality teaching programmes and delivery, high expectations and in some cases natural ability for the positive data that we produce.

Our good friends from the Education Review Office visited this year and left pleased, which in turn pleased me. I was not actually worried about their review as I was and am confident in our systems and teaching and it was good that they were able to confirm many things I felt I already knew around what was happening here at Kimbolton School. My two favourite comments in our final report were that....

Learners express a positive sense of belonging and pride in their school that supports their wellbeing and engagement with learning.

School leaders ensure expectations for high quality teaching and learning practices are clear, well implemented and responsive, to support all learners.

I would like to thank the board for their contributions to the smooth running of the school. A lot of the work they do is behind the scenes and they hold myself to account for ensuring that decisions are made in the best interests of student learning and wellbeing.

I am not someone who gives too much public praise, and prefer talking to people one on one to show how much I appreciate what they do. This being said I do want to single out Stu Morton and Naomi Clifton for their contributions to the school. Both Stu and Naomi were actually on the board when I was appointed and so we have spent four years working together.

Stu was the Presiding Member when I was appointed and together we were able to learn and navigate our way through the transition from the previous principal. He was willing to help, not only around governance but also in other areas, including maintenance and general advice. Stu's trust and support of some of our new initiatives allowed us as a school to grow and benefit students learning. Stu also ensured a smooth transition from him being Presiding Member to Wayne Jenkins taking over. I am sure the board would agree the switch has been seamless and this is in part thanks to Stu's professionalism and support.

Amongst other things, Naomi has overseen many changes within our bus runs and has been a strong advocate for student safety on the buses. She was always easy to work with, kept her suggestions to a minimum, but every contribution she made was thoughtful and beneficial. She leaves the board knowing that bus runs are safer, buses are safer and as a result our students are safer.

The KSSC are a valuable part of our school and I also thank them for their support. Of course the leadership team within the KSSC do a great job but I am sure they'd agree that it is the parents that support the fundraisers that ensure the ultimate success of the group. This year we are especially appreciative of the contribution to ensure the school pool building improvements are able to be done quickly, and the work will begin on those changes in March.

The staff require thanks, but I will do that in a less public forum. I will say that when we put students' learning and wellbeing at the forefront of our thinking and decision making, then success follows. This also requires skilled teachers and support staff and the students are lucky to have skilled educators working with and for them.

Last year we confirmed our strategic direction as a school and as we move into our second year of working through this I remain focused on our strategic goals including our first strategic goal which is...

"Teaching and Learning is at the heart of all we do at Kimbolton School. Our expectation is that all students will strive towards their own personal excellence, through the support of highly trained staff and programmes." We want to ensure that here at Kimbolton School we are catering for students at all levels and this goal means a lot to me. As always, I remind you if you ever want to come and have a chat about things you're loving that we do, or areas where you think we could even more strongly benefit student learning and well-being, I would love to hear from you.

Right, that is more than enough from me. Have a good xmas, an enjoyable holiday and we look forward to seeing you all late January where we will continue to work hard to, "Unleash the Potential of all."
