
KIMBOLTON SCHOOL

I consider myself more on the traditional side of education and life in general, but have come away with my mind blown with the potential of AI, now and into the future. Whether we like it or not, AI is a thing and will continue to advance. We need to ensure we are giving students a well rounded education, and where practical utilise AI.

This does not mean that it is more important than core curriculum learning and getting students to be competent readers, writers and mathematicians will always be my first priority as Kimbolton School Principal, along with ensuring values are well embedded for students.

The main takeaway I took from the trip was around the increased use of screen time and the concerns that that would have on parents and teachers. The only genuine suggestion they made around this was to ensure that all screen time is purposeful for learning. As a staff we will be reviewing what we use computers and IPads for and where needed making changes.

I will be starting the holidays with a few days of golf in Queenstown and am hoping the snow melts very soon. I wish you all well with the upcoming school holidays with your kids and we look forward to seeing you all back on October 14.
